Warm weather

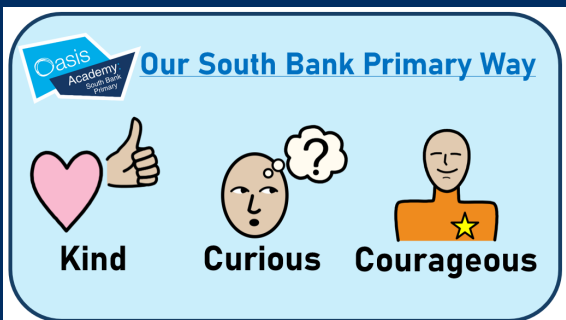
A reminder that while the weather is hot, children may come to school in their PE kits or wearing plain shorts.

Primary School Immunisation Programme

The South London Children and Young People’s Community Immunisation Service provides vaccinations for children living in and attending school in twelve south London boroughs.

Providing routine vaccination in schools has numerous benefits for schools and wider communities including providing a healthy environment by reducing the number of vaccine preventable diseases in the school.

What vaccines should my young person have before they start primary school?

Your child should have received a number of routine vaccinations against some very serious diseases as they were growing up. It is important to check that your child has received two doses of the MMR vaccine before starting primary school to protect them against measles, mumps, and rubella.

What vaccines will my young person be offered during primary school?

Every year, your child will be offered the flu vaccine. This continues when they are in secondary school as well. Additionally, they will be offered three more vaccines in secondary school.

Your child can also have the chance to catch up on missing doses of the MMR vaccine.

Who do we contact about immunisations?

How do I check my child’s vaccination status?

If your child received their routine vaccinations as a baby and young child, it will be recorded in their personal health record (Red Book). You can also ask your GP surgery to check.

What if my child misses their vaccine at school?

Our Immunisation teams run catch-up clinics after school, at the weekends, and during the school holidays.

How do parents consent to vaccinations?

We use an online consent form to gain parental consents. This is a secure system, and means less time is spent processing paper consent forms.

Can my child have their vaccines at our GP surgery?

The Immunisation team are responsible for delivering all school age vaccinations.

Parents are welcome to discuss immunisations with their doctor, but vaccination must be performed either in school, or at one of our catch-up clinics, by our nurses.

My child is nervous about getting vaccinated - what should we do?

Tell your immunisation nurse - they are used to helping people who are nervous and will work with them to overcome your fears.

If you don’t want your child to have their vaccines at school, you can come to a catch-up clinic. These clinics are quieter and calmer, and you and your child will have more time to talk to a nurse about their nerves.

Lambeth's Holiday Activities & Food

Dear Parent/Carer

I'm delighted to let you know that this summer Lambeth Council will be hosting our Holiday Activities and Food Programme.

We are partnering with local holiday club providers across the borough to provide an exciting programme of meals and activities for children and young people in our local communities. Free places are available for children between the ages of 4 and 16 years, who are eligible for benefits-related school meals.

The programme will run from **Monday 28 July to Friday 29 August 2025** and is designed to give local families on benefits-related free school meals access to free, healthy food and fun activities over the summer holidays. Each programme will provide:

- Free, healthy, and tasty food
- Fun physical activity sessions
- A wide range of other activities to suit different ages and personalities
- Opportunities to learn more about food and nutrition for children and families

This year we are introducing a new way to book with providers. We are using a booking system called Eequ. You will be able to book up to 16 sessions per eligible child, with all 60+ providers in Lambeth, from Friday 27 June at 8am. You are able to visit the platform from today and register your interest in activities, but the full range of activities on offer may not be available until 27th June at 8am.
